Brazil-Nut Gravy

2 ½ cups water (halved)*



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Editor's Note and Study to Show Thyself Approved

The story is told of the ship that was trapped in a severe storm at sea. All were preparing to abandon ship, all except one young lady who was calmly playing with her dolls. When asked if she were not afraid, she calmly replied, "No, because my father is the captain."



Today, when every wind of doctrine is blowing and the storms of life seem to trap us, let us learn to keep our eyes turned heavenward and say, "I am not afraid because the Captain is my Father!"

In the Bible, God reminds us over 100 times to "Fear not" or "Be not afraid." As I face challenges in the world, two of my "fear not" favorites are those of Isaiah 41 because of their additional promise of help. *"Fear thou not; for I am with thee: be not dismayed; for I am thy God: I will strengthen thee; yea, I will help thee; yea, I will uphold thee with the right hand of my righteousness... For I the LORD thy God will hold thy right hand, saying unto thee, Fear not; I will help thee."* Isaiah 41:10, 13

In addition, one day I read this quotation from an old <u>Youth's Instructor</u> that I also try to remember when I am wrestling with difficult Bible questions. It says, "Those who know Jesus Christ as their personal Saviour have the privilege of being educated and trained in a higher school than that of men, and of being tutored under higher wisdom than that of finite beings. <u>They may come under the tutorship</u> <u>of the greatest Teacher the world ever knew</u>, [See John 16:13] and partake of the same knowledge that he gave to Daniel. Those who are humble in heart, those who feel their need of higher wisdom, and do not rely upon their own finite judgment, but search earnestly to know the will of God, may draw from the source of all knowledge, and obtain grace, prudence, discretion, and judgment. They will realize the fulfilment of the assurance of God's word: 'The entrance of thy words giveth light; it giveth understanding unto the simple.' Those who are meek and lowly in heart, will learn of Christ, and find rest unto their souls." {YI, September 19, 1895 par. 1}

This is an amazing thought, that Christ himself will be our personal tutor. When praying, I have often claimed the promise that God will help me and be my own personal tutor. At times, it seemed like He was just standing there waiting for me to give up struggling on my own and ask for help. It always reminds me of Christian in <u>Pilgrim's Progress</u> when he fell into the Slough of Despond. He calls for help and one by the name of "Help" shows up. Often like Christian, we struggle and struggle, but trusting in man/ourselves only sinks us deeper in the muck. We try too hard when faith is so simple, we look above it. Paul warns, "But I fear, lest by any means, as the serpent beguiled Eve through his subtilty, so your minds should be corrupted from the <u>simplicity that is in Christ</u>." 2 Cor. 11:3 Sometimes, the theologian and scholar in us would do well to learn more like a child. Jesus did say, "Verily I say unto you, Whosoever shall not receive the kingdom of God as a little child, he shall not enter therein." Mark 10:15

Consider the following story of a little girl who was only about eight years old (and presumably lived in the mission field). Her mother had just tucked her into bed, said their prayers, kissed her good night, turned off the light, and closed the door when suddenly the little girl saw this beautiful white being of light standing in front of her.

Calling the girl by name, this beautiful-looking angel said, "I'm an angel sent from God."

Now even though the little girl had been raised in a Christian home, she was afraid, and she looked at that angel and she said, "You're not from God." And the angel said, "Well, how do you know that?" "

"Because," answered the little girl, "every place in the Bible where an angel appeared and the people were afraid-- the angel said, 'Fear not.' I'm afraid. And you didn't say 'fear not.' You can't be from God."

Then suddenly, the angel turned into this hideous-looking monster that swooped down on the little girl and said, "Would you rather me be looking like this?" Then, apparently, rebuked by God, the being vanished away into the darkness.

I love how in this story the simplicity of the Bible story helped a little girl to discern an evil angel. For after endorsing the "simplicity in Christ," Paul continued, "For such are false apostles, deceitful workers, transforming themselves into the apostles of Christ. And no marvel; for Satan himself is transformed into an angel of light." 2 Corinthians 11:13,14 Yet biblical simplicity is plenty to expose them.

It also shows the one main difference between Babylon and the Kingdom of God. Babylon consists of trust and exaltation of man, man's wisdom, man's abilities, man's traditions; *"let <u>us</u> build <u>us</u> a city and a tower...let <u>us</u> make <u>us</u> a name" or <i>"ls not this great Babylon, that I have built for the house of the kingdom by the might of my power, and for the honour of my majesty?"* Genesis 11:4, Daniel 4:30 But God calls man out of Babylon's worship of man to Christ's Kingdom consisting of trust and exaltation of God's way, God's wisdom, God's abilities, God's law. Only the foolish remain in Babylon. (Rev. 18:4) As Bob Jones, Sr., once said, *"A man is a fool who leans on the arm of flesh when he can be supported by the arm of Omnipotence."* Why be fearful when, with Jesus by your side, you can be faithfully fearless?



Church and State, Separated or United? Study to Show Thyself Approved

We are seeing much agitation in the world today about the connection between church and state. The wise will study to see what the Bible actually says about the topic. "/For the weapons of our water are not cornal, but might through God to the pulling down of strong

Did Christ place a separation between the state and His kingdom? "And Jesus answering said unto them, Render to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's. And they marvelled at him." Mark 12:17

What happened historically when secular governments began to make religious laws, uniting church and state?

"Then Nebuchadnezzar spake, and said, Blessed be the God of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego...Therefore I make a decree, That <u>every people</u>, nation, and language, <u>which speak any thing amiss against the God</u> of Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego, <u>shall be cut in pieces</u>, and their houses shall be made a dunghill..." Daniel 3:28,29

"Then these men assembled, and found Daniel praying and making supplication before his God. Then they came near, and spake before the king concerning the king's decree; Hast thou not signed a decree, that <u>every</u> <u>man that shall ask a petition of any God or man within thirty days, save of</u> <u>thee, O king, shall be cast into the den of lions</u>? The king answered and said, The thing is true, according to the law of the Medes and Persians, which altereth not." Daniel 6:11, 12

In prophetic Babylon, are church and state separated or united?

Keep in mind in Bible prophecy a woman represents a church (Eph. 5:23, Jer. 6:2) and both kings and beasts represent kingdoms or the state (Daniel 7:17.23).

"And there came one of the seven angels which had the seven vials, and talked with me, saying unto me, Come hither; I will shew unto thee the judgment of the great whore that sitteth upon many waters: With whom the kings of the earth have committed fornication, and the inhabitants of the earth have been made drunk with the wine of her fornication. So he carried me away in the spirit into the wilderness: and I saw a woman sit upon a scarlet coloured beast, full of names of blasphemy, having seven heads and ten horns. And the woman was arrayed in purple and scarlet colour, and decked with gold and precious stones and pearls, having a golden cup in her hand full of abominations and filthiness of her fornication: And <u>upon her forehead was a name written, MYSTERY, BABYLON THE</u> <u>GREAT</u>, THE MOTHER OF HARLOTS AND ABOMINATIONS OF THE EARTH... And the woman which thou sawest is that great city, which reigneth over the kings of the earth." Revelation 17:1-5,18

"And after these things I saw another angel come down from heaven, having great power; and the earth was lightened with his glory. And he cried mightily with a strong voice, saying, <u>Babylon</u> the great is fallen, is fallen, and is become the habitation of devils, and the hold of every foul spirit, and a cage of every unclean and hateful bird. For all nations have drunk of the wine of the wrath of her fornication, and <u>the kings of the earth have committed fornication with her</u>, and the merchants of the earth are waxed rich through the abundance of her delicacies. And I heard another voice from heaven, saying, Come out of her, my people, that ye be not partakers of her sins, and that ye receive not of her plagues." Rev. 18:1-4

"And the third angel followed them, saying with a loud voice, If any man worship the beast and his image, and receive his mark in his forehead, or in his hand, The same shall drink of the wine of the wrath of God, ... and they have no rest day nor night, who worship the beast and his image, and whosoever receiveth the mark of his name." Revelation 14:9-11


What does Revelation 13 predict will be the sad result of this unbiblical union?

Pandemic of Fear Prophetic News Notes and Swift Runner Health






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Fear also ruins any mental advantages. In Old Testament times, God did not allow the fearful in

the army of Israel. Deuteronomy 20:8 expounds, "And the officers shall speak further unto the people, and they shall say, What man is there that is fearful and fainthearted? let him go and return unto his house, lest his brethren's heart faint as well as his heart." Today, in neuroscience and technology world, this concept has been affirmed. In a presentation titled "The Brain is the Battlefield of the Future," Dr. James Giordano, professor of neurology and biochemistry at Georgetown University and editor of the book Neurotechnology in



<u>National Security and Defense</u> briefed the military of the effect of using "neuro-microbials with high neuropsychiatric symptom clusters for public panic." He described the psychological effect of fear from just publicizing online that you released a 'bug" in a public place or large city, and then, for example, posting online "I did it, yes. I'm that dangerous G-group that you should all be afraid of...I've let these buggies go all over the country. And your early warning signs are agitation, anxiety, worry, sleeplessness, stomach problems, heart problems." He explains how even if only a small group of people actually received any biologic agent, the fear effect is massive. Giordano continues, "How many people would I have to affect? We modeled it, somewhere between 12 and 240. What would be the effect? Hang on folks! Within 41 to 45 days we would crash the US public health system. Crash it, and so doing I render the US infrastructure vulnerable."² This model evidences the mental effects of a pandemic of fear.

But the Bible also makes clear that the fearful do not succeed spiritually either. One reason for this is that people that are scared make bad decisions. "But the fearful, and unbelieving, and the abominable, and murderers, and whoremongers, and sorcerers, and idolaters, and all liars, shall have their part in the lake which burneth with fire and brimstone: which is the second death." Revelation 21:8 Heed the warning, and if you are fearful, make getting to know God a priority because only by a close relationship with God can you overcome fear.

The Bible validates the mind's effect on the body stating, "For as he thinketh in his heart, so is he..." Proverbs 23:7 In addition, many of us have heard it said for years that "Sickness of the mind prevails everywhere. Nine tenths of the diseases from which men suffer have their foundation here."³ Now neurobiologists are corroborating this. Cognitive neurobiologist Caroline Leaf, Ph.D., specializes in healing emotional traumas and physical diseases through "brain detoxing." Leaf states that "Research shows that around 87% of illnesses can be attributed to our thought life, and approximately 13% to diet, genetics and environment. Studies conclusively link more chronic diseases (also known as lifestyle diseases) to an epidemic of toxic emotions in our culture. These toxic emotions can cause migraines, hypertension, strokes, cancer, skin problems, diabetes, infections, and allergies, just to name a few."⁴ The diet/mind health connection is somewhat hard to separate since what we eat or drink affects how we think (that's why drunk driving is against the law), but what we think also determines what we put into our mouths. However, it is an inarguable fact that our mental health is seriously affecting our physical health. Because of this, those that seek to help others overcome physical disease must also learn to overcome mental health problems. Leaf also states, "Toxic stressors are activated by fear. So fear is the root of all stress. **Research shows that fear, all on its own, triggers more than 1,400 known physical and chemical responses and activates more than 30 different hormones.**"

Since these chemical responses from toxic emotions like fear can negatively affect our digestive system, heart, immune system, et cetera, we must learn to think better. 2 Corinthians 10:4, 5 rightly expounds, "(For the weapons of our warfare are not carnal, but mighty through God to the pulling down of strong holds;) Casting down imaginations, and every high thing that exalteth itself against the knowledge of God, and bringing into captivity every thought to the obedience of Christ;"

In accordance with the Bible here and in Philippians 4:8, Dr. Leaf, explains how we actually can filter our thoughts. As things we see or hear stimulate the brain, we may choose to eliminate those that are toxic and replace them with better ones. A prime example is

demonstrated by forgiveness instead of hate. This allows the brain to remove the toxic "thorns" in the brain formed from hating and creates new pathways of forgiveness in the brain making it easier to forgive the next time. "The good news is we can change those pathways within four days and create new ones within twenty-one days! In fact as soon as you are conscious of the ['reformed'] memory, it will start changing physically in your brain"⁵

One neat way to filter your thoughts is hinted at in Ecclesiastes 10:2. It states, "A wise man's heart is at his right hand; but a fool's heart at his left." If you parallel the heart, in this instance to the physiology of the brain, you find that "The brain builds a double memory of every thought, one on the left side of the brain and one on the right. The left brain's perspective on information processes it detail to big picture, while the right side processes it big picture to detail."⁴ Often, if we will simply zoom out and look at the big picture, considering things like "In five years will this matter?" or "Is anything eternal at stake?" our problems dissolve away into insignificance.

Replacement is also important. Dr. Leaf states, "There are only two types of emotions, each with their own anatomy and physiology: love and fear. All other emotions are variations of these. Out of the love branch come emotions of joy, trust, caring, peace, contentment, patience, kindness, gentleness, etc. Fear-based emotions include bitterness, anger, hatred, rage, anxiety, guilt, shame, inadequacy, depression, confusion, etc."⁵ Love then is the replacement for fear. 1 John 4:18 states, "There is no fear in love; but perfect love casteth out fear: because fear hath torment. He that feareth is not made perfect in love."

Dr. Daniel Amen, a worldly leading scientist on the brain, explains how negative thoughts in the brain release bad chemicals that cause physical reactions making you feel bad but positive thought release positive chemicals. He suggests the following two questions to ask habitually for getting rid of negative thoughts. He says, "Ask yourself, 'Is it true? Is it absolutely true?'"⁶ I can't help but notice, these questions echo the filter of Philippians 4:8 "Finally, brethren, <u>whatsoever things are true, whatsoever things are honest</u>, whatsoever things are just, whatsoever things are pure, whatsoever things are lovely, whatsoever things are of good report; if there be any virtue, and if there be any praise, think on these things." Don't give in to a pandemic of fear; for your health, claim the promise today, "For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind." 2 Timothy 1:7

God's Amazing Creatures


The viceroy is a bright orange butterfly that lives in North America. Viceroy caterpillars eat the leaves of willow trees, poplar trees, and cottonwood trees. The viceroy butterfly looks so much like the monarch butterfly that it can be mistaken for one, even though it is smaller. Viceroys' similar coloring to monarch butterflies makes predatory birds not want to eat them because monarch butterflies are not edible to birds. So So, unless a bird has never tried to eat a monarch, it thinks viceroys are the same.

Isn't it interesting and amazing how God created viceroy butterflies to be protected?

God made our bodies very special. The Bible says,

"I will praise thee; for I am fearfully and wonderfully made..." Psalm 139:14

Your body is made up of little parts called cells. God made each cell so tiny, you cannot see it unless you look at it through a microscope. But each cell is almost like a whole little city full of busy activity. To keep your cell city healthy, it needs good air, water, food, freedom from poison, and the cell's trash to be removed.



See if you can find each part of the cell and match it to the part of the city it is like?

The microtubules are like the roads that allow things to go back and forth throughout the cell.

The mitochondria is like the power house for the cell. It makes the power for the whole little cell city.

The endoplasmic reticulum (ER) is like a factory that makes things and puts things together in the cell.

The Golgi apparatus is like a cell warehouse where things are sorted, fixed, packaged, and mailed out.

The cell membrane or "skin" is like a double wall of soldiers standing around the cell city to protect it and keep the "bad things" out while they allow the good things in.

The nucleus is like the command center of each little cell city. The DNA in the nucleus is the law that God put in each of our cells.
