Sneaky Bars

1 cup each kind of nuts- cashews, brazil nuts, almonds, pumpkin seeds (You may create your own combination)

1 cup peanut butter 1 cup honey

¾ to 1 cup carob powder (I like the roasted variety)

Chop nuts into chip sizes, and add peanut butter and honey. Add carob powder until stiff and "half the bowl" sticks to the spoon.

Spread onto a freezable pan lined with saran wrap. Use a wet

During the Civil War, William Scott was in Company K of the Third Vermont Regiment in the Union Army. He was only 18 years old. One night he volunteered to go on guard duty in the place of a sick comrade. Unfortunately, the next day his own turn came to be on guard duty that night. The next morning a relief guard found him asleep at his post. He was court-martialed, found guilty, and condemned to be shot within 24 hours. His comrades felt

terrible. His captain said it was his fault, that he should have known better than to let a soldier do all-night guard duty two nights in a row. They knew there was only one who could help—Abraham Lincoln, and to Lincoln they went. The captain told the story. Lincoln understood. His heart was moved with mercy. As he thought of all the possible complications, he said "I'll have to do it myself, and I'll have to do it today."



The story is told of how he went down to the camp and had a long talk with

William Scott. He finally said, "William, you are not going to be shot. I am going to send you back to your regiment. But how are you going to pay my bill?" The lad hardly knew what to answer. Then putting his hand on William's shoulder, the president said, "William, if from this day you will do your duty, so that if you suddenly came to the time to die, you could look me in the face and say, 'I have kept my promise; I have done my duty as a soldier,' then my bill will be paid."

We too, have all been found sleeping at our post as watchman on the walls of Zion. We are condemned to death and our only hope is in Jesus and his mercy and forgiveness. Are we soldiers worthy of the name of Christian? Paul wrote to Timothy telling him the characteristics of a good soldier, *"Thou therefore endure hardness, as a good soldier of Jesus Christ.* **No man that warreth entangleth himself with the affairs of this life;** that he may

We are to keep ourselves separate from the practices of this world. This is the duty that God himself calls us to. "Be ye not unequally yoked together with unbelievers: for what fellowship hath righteousness with unrighteousness? and what communion hath light with

darkness? ... Wherefore come out from among them, and be ye separate, saith the Lord, and touch not the **unclean thing**; and I will receive you, And will be a Father unto you, and ye shall be my sons and daughters, saith the Lord Almighty". **2 Cor. 6:14, 17-18**

The Bible also tells us that as watchmen, we have another duty to our comrades who may be "sin-sick". We are to warn them from the error of their ways. "Son of man, I have made thee a watchman unto the house of Israel: therefore hear the word at my mouth, and give them warning from me. When I say unto the wicked, Thou shalt surely die; and thou givest him not warning, nor speakest to warn the wicked from his wicked way, to save his life; the same wicked man shall die in his iniquity; but his blood will I require at thine hand. THE CHOCOLATE DRUG STORE

Renowned botanist Carolus Linnaeus named the chocolate tree as Theobroma which in English literally means *"food of the gods*'." And during the travels of Spanish explorer, Hernando Cortez, the Aztec natives offered him some 'chocolatl' and informed him that the beans from the drink were derived from heaven and every sip of 'chocolatl' infused wisdom and knowledge among the people. But if it is really a blessing from heaven, why is it often called Devil's food?

"Chocolate isn't really A DRUG, it's the whole drugstore sort of wrapped up all in one." This statement in a speech by Neil Barnard, M.D., should make us wonder if this is a food we should be eating. As its scientific name hints, besides containing caffeine, chocolate contains a compound we know as theobromine, another stimulant causing a "high" followed by depression. Dr. Barnard adds that it also contains phenylethylamine, an amphetamine-like compound.

"Researchers checked whether any of the fats (which are plentiful) in chocolate mimic the chemical structure of psychoactive drugs. As it turns out, chocolate contains compounds similar to those in marijuana." **You'll Rust Out Before You Wear Out,** Royce K. Bailey, M.D., pg. 19.

"From the Johns Hopkins Departments of Psychiatry and Behavioral Sciences comes the report that caffeine produces many behavioral effects similar to those of cocaine and amphetamines. Caffeine increased

"Chocolate isn't really A DRUG, it's the whole drugstore sort of wrapped up all in one." cocaine-seeking behavior measurably. This infers that caffeine can be a gateway to stronger drugs. Unfortunately, caffeine is the most common drug habit in the United States." **(The Journal of Health and Healing, pg. 10)**

We also find that besides mental effects, chocolate has other negative effects. Due to the fact that fermentation is essential to develop the chocolate

flavor, workers cut the bean pods from the cacao tree and pile them in the yard to ferment for three to eight days. During this process it attracts insects, rodents, and dogs. One lady in Borneo reports that *"mangy dogs urinate all over them."* This may be the reason for many of the allergies to chocolate. Even the US Dept. of Health, Education and Welfare, acknowledges chocolate's contamination from *"insects, rodents, and other natural"*

contaminants". Possibly even more worrisome, is the fact that chocolate appears to contribute to cancer. Methylxanthines, included in chocolate as caffeine and theobromine are linked to increased cell growth in certain glandular tissues-especially the breast and prostate. In fact, women are advised to discontinue the use of coffee, teas, colas, chocolates and all other forms of methylxanthines as a breast cancer control measure. http://www.ncbi.nlm.nih.gov/pubmed/8280834, http://www.ucheepines.org/chocolate-vs-carob



Fortunately, God has not left us without something better. The Carob tree produces a long pod which, when ground into powder makes a wonderful replacement for chocolate. It contains no caffeine or methylxanthines. It is also high in pectin, useful in treating diarrhea, and recent studies indicate it may be helpful in lowering your cholesterol level. It nourishes the body, and is a high source of potassium, calcium and magnesium. "Bless the LORD, O my soul...Who satisfieth thy mouth with good things; so that thy youth is renewed like the eagle's". **Psalm 103:1a, 5**
